THE RECEPTION AND TRANSLATION OF HOLY RELICS

The altar party moves to the West Doors to welcome the relics into the church.

Dear Siblings in Christ: With great joy and devotion, we receive these holy relics of God’s blessed saints, Oscar Romero, who was martyred for his faithfulness to the Gospel; Francis of Assisi, who was sent to restore Christ’s Church; Nicholas, who showed forth God’s compassion and through whom he has done great wonders; John Vianney, whose heart burned with love for God as an example for all his priests; Elizabeth Ann Seton, our Nation’s first recognized saint, who dedicated herself to spreading the Light of Christ; and this piece of the True Cross, the holy tree upon which our Lord gave himself up to suffering and death for the salvation of the whole world.

Our Parish calls upon these great saints whom we honor and venerate to inspire us to imitate them in walking in holiness and faithfulness, and to offer their prayers for us before the throne of God where they await us. In gratitude for the mighty works God has done through the lives of his saints and for the support of that great cloud of witnesses who love, surround, and uplift us always, we welcome these relics to be honored and cherished in this church, that they may continually inspire, comfort, and encourage us, remind us of the Mystery of the Cross and of the loving presence of the Communion of Saints, and point us to the glory that you have in store for all who steadfastly serve you and follow where you lead. **Amen.**

While the fanfare is played, the relics are translated to the nave.

Once they arrive at the altar, all kneel together with the Priest to offer the following prayer.

Let us pray. Almighty God, by your Holy Spirit you have made us one with your saints in heaven and on earth: Grant that in our earthly pilgrimage we may always be supported by this fellowship of love and prayer, and know ourselves to be surrounded by their witness to your power and mercy. We ask this for the sake of Jesus Christ, in whom all our intercessions are acceptable through the Spirit, and who lives and reigns for ever and ever. **Amen.**

Then he wrote down the dream: I, Daniel, saw in my vision by night the four winds of heaven stirring up the great sea, and four great beasts came up out of the sea, different from one another.

As for me, Daniel, my spirit was troubled within me, and the visions of my head terrified me. I approached one of the attendants to ask him the truth concerning all this. So he said that he would disclose to me the interpretation of the matter: "As for these four great beasts, four kings shall arise out of the earth. But the holy ones of the Most High shall receive the kingdom and possess the kingdom for ever—for ever and ever."

SECOND READING

Ephesians 1:11-23

A reading from the letter of St. Paul to the Ephesians.

In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, having been destined according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will, so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory. In him you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; this is the pledge of our inheritance toward redemption as God's own people, to the praise of his glory.

I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love toward all the saints, and for this reason I do not cease to give thanks for you as I remember you in my prayers. I pray that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation as you come to know him, so that, with the eyes of your heart enlightened, you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance among the saints, and what is the

immeasurable greatness of his power for us who believe, according to the working of his great power. God put this power to work in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places, far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the age to come. And he has put all things under his feet and has made him the head over all things for the church, which is his body, the fullness of him who fills all in all.

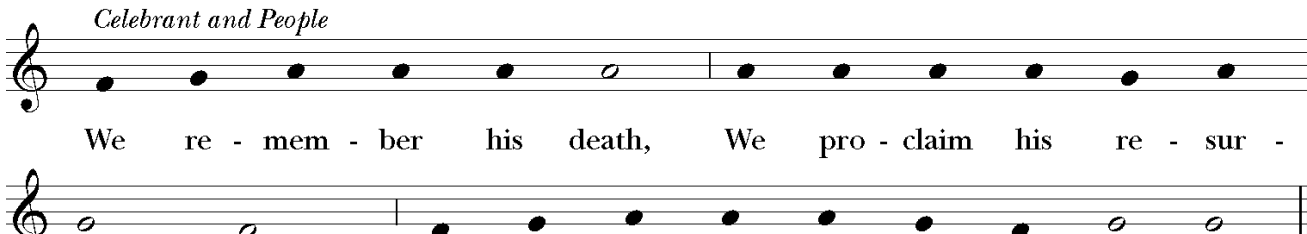

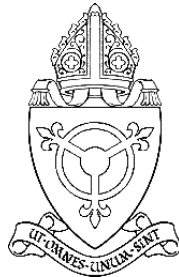
